The official site of the Borough of St. Clair is **www.stclair-gov.org** for information concerning the Borough. Such information includes a list of public officials, local ordinances, forms, a copy of the monthly newsletter, council meeting minutes, and links for CodeRED and to pay your electric bill. The agenda for the council meeting will be posted on the web page 24 hours prior to the meeting.

The Borough office will be closed on Tuesday, November 8 and Wednesday, November 9 due to Election Day. Normal sanitation collection will occur.

In observance of Veteran's Day, Friday, November 11, the Borough office will be closed and there will be no recycling collection. Recycling collection for Friday will occur on Wednesday, November 9.

When **paying your bill on-line**, make sure your on-line electric bill payment reaches the Borough in a timely manner. **ONLY** use the St. Clair Borough website. Go to www.stclair-gov.org. Click on the RED button that says "Pay Electric Bill," and follow instructions. Reminder: The borough office will no longer be taking credit card payments over the phone.

The large item collection date is Wednesday, October 19, 2022.

Each large item is \$5. Place an envelope containing a check (no cash), name, address and phone number where the large item is to be collected. Place the envelope in the drop off box in front of the Municipal Building.

The Municipal Building is currently undergoing construction. The Borough office is still open for business. Payments can be placed in the drop box out front. If you need to speak to someone, ring the doorbell at the window at the bottom of the ramp or call 570-429-0640.

Historical Note - October 2022

The Eagle Colliery or later the Herbine was started in 1826 by Frederick Hass who operated it until 1832. Thomas and William Johns operated it from 1844 until 1867. They were succeeded by George W. Johns & Brother from 1867 until 1882. The operation was then taken over by the Pennsylvania and Reading Coal and Iron Corporation from 1882 until 1889. From 1889 until 1954 it was leased to the St. Clair Coal Company which was owned and operated by various individuals during that time span. From 1826 until 1934 this operation produced approximately 12,000,000 tons of coal and employed up to 800 individuals at one time. This site is now the Coal Creek Commercial Center. The port of St. Clair known as John's Patch takes its name from the Johns family who owned the colliery from 1844 until 1882.
