The agenda for the council meeting will be posted on the web page 24 hours prior to the meeting.

The Borough office will be closed on Tuesday, November 7 due to Election Day. Normal sanitation will occur. In observance of Veteran's Day, the Borough office will be closed on Friday, November 10 and there will be no recycling collection. Recycling collection for Friday will occur on Wednesday, November 8.

Historical Note

During the 1870's and 1880's St. Clair was home to a shovel manufacturing plant as well as a box factory.

About 1871 a Mr. Bowen opened a shovel manufacturing shop. He made shovels for use in the mines of St. Clair and vicinity. Between 1870 -1880 a box factory was established in St. Clair by Mr. Samuel H. Daddow (1827-1875) of the miner's cap and squib manufacturing operations. Wooden boxes were made for the squibs. This industry continued until there was no longer a demand for squibs.
