### Mayor's Report

- 1. A heartfelt thank you is extended to the Street Department Superintendent Kevin Dempsey and all the members of the Street Department for the excellent work done in erecting a flag pole at the historic Borough Cemetery as well as preparing the cemetery grounds for Memorial Day. The new flag pole was donated to our Borough by Hydro Extrusion North America of Cressona.
- 2. As vacation time is up coming, residents are reminded that they may obtain a Vacation Form from the St. Clair Police Department. Once the form is completed and returned to the Police Department, patrols could increase and the police could contact residents should there be an emergency at their property. Forms may be obtained by calling 570-429-2240 or 570-429-3050 as well as on the St. Clair Borough website. It goes without saying that those on vacation and away from home should not advertise that fact on social media until they return home.
- 3. Residents are reminded of the legal restrictions on the use of fireworks that have been enacted by the PA General Assembly. Some of these are:
  - 1. Fireworks cannot be directed at another person
  - 2. Fireworks cannot be discharged from or directed at a building or a vehicle
  - 3. Fireworks cannot be discharged within 150 feet of a building or vehicle.
  - 4. Fireworks cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance.

# **Historical Note**

In 1831, an early landowner in our community, St. Clair Nichols, set apart a lot for a graveyard. Mr. Anthony Irwin, a local resident, helped to fence the lot and was the caretaker for several years. Almost 20 years later, land developers Carey, Lee, and Hart, deeded the lot to the Borough of St. Clair after its incorporation as a borough; to be used as a community cemetery. There are no existing records of burials from 1831until 1850. The burials under the Borough's governance can be found on the Borough of St. Clair's website. The next two cemeteries founded for residents of St. Clair were located west of the Borough in New Castle Township and were religious in nature. St. Boniface Roman Catholic Cemetery in 1858 and St. Mary's Roman Catholic Cemetery in the early 1860's. A new community non-denominational cemetery was dedicated in 1867 in the eastern part of the Borough by the Independent Order of Odd Fellows.
