<u>ATTENTION RESIDENTS</u>: Please be mindful of our *Snow Removal Ordinance* which states that a path on the sidewalk, free of snow and ice, of at least 24 inches, must be maintained before 12 noon of the next day after snow has fallen. Also, when removing snow and ice from the sidewalk, it is unlawful to place snow or ice into the street or any public thorofare of the Borough.

The **CPA Audit of the Borough of Saint Clair** for the fiscal year 2023 is available for public inspection during normal business hours at the Municipal Building.

PennDOT announced **Wade Road and Hancock Street will be milled and paved**, and handicap ramps will be installed at certain intersections in the Spring of 2025.

The **St. Clair Area Food Pantry** offers a <u>drive thru pick up</u> on N. Mill Street on the third Wednesday of the even months from 10:30 a.m., at the First Primitive Methodist Church, 115 N.
