The official site of the Borough of St. Clair is **www.stclairpa.gov** for information concerning the Borough. The website includes several important links including registration for CodeRED and to pay your electric bill. It also includes a list of public officials, local ordinances, forms, a copy of the monthly newsletter, and council meeting minutes. The agenda for the council meeting will be posted on the web page 24 hours prior to the meeting.

The large item collection dates are: February 19, March 19 and April 16.

Each large item is \$5. Place a check, the name, address and phone number where the large item is to be collected and the item to be collected, in an envelope. Place the envelope in the drop off box in front of the Municipal Building. Please no cash. <u>Large item collection is always the third Wednesday of the month</u>. We will no longer be collecting refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, or any item containing freon.

The St. Clair Borough has received a grant to construct a **youth basketball court** to be located adjacent to the Third Street Playground.

You will soon be seeing a brand-new garbage truck in your neighborhood courtesy of a Pennsylvania grant.

There are several grant opportunities for the Borough that are currently being reviewed.

<u>Attention Residents</u>: When a snow emergency is declared, there will be NO PARKING ALLOWED on SECOND STREET and HANCOCK STREET. Watch for posting of streets.

<u>ATTENTION RESIDENTS</u>: Please be mindful of our *Snow Removal Ordinance* which states that a path on the sidewalk, free of snow and ice, of at least 24 inches, must be maintained before 12 noon of the next day after snow has fallen. Also, when removing snow and ice from the sidewalk, it is unlawful to place snow or ice into the street or any public thorofare of the Borough.

<u>ATTENTION LANDLORDS:</u> Rental Ordinance #398 requires a **Rental Registration** Form to be completed at the *beginning of each year*. Please complete your Rental Registration form along with fees and return to St. Clair Borough. The form is on the St. Clair Borough website under "Documents and Forms." All renters are required to be registered. **IT IS A REQUIREMENT.**

One of the earliest musical groups organized in St. Clair was the Union Cornet Band in 1862. It was comprised of 19 instruments. It was reorganized in 1871 and was chartered in 1873. The next two bands organized were the Citizen's Band and the Schlottman Band. In 1884, Peter Schuster, Elmer Boyer, and James Tucker organized the Perseverance Band which was directed by William H. Badge. It consisted of 27 members.
