The residents of St. Clair in 1850 were either immigrants from or had ancestry of English, German, Scotch-Irish, Welsh and Irish origins.

WHEREAS, Albert Mettam who immigrated from Nottingham, England established Mettam Bros. Lumber Company in the Borough of St. Clair in 1885; and,

WHEREAS, five generations of the Mettam family has operated this business for 140 years; and,

WHEREAS, the Mettam family has contributed to the economic and civic life of the Borough of St. Clair with goods and services as well as employment opportunities for the people of St. Clair; and,

WHEREAS, the great grandfather of the present generation of the Mettam family, Arch Mettam, was one of the founders of the Peoples Safe Deposit Bank in the Borough of St. Clair; and,

WHEREAS, the fifth generation of the Mettam family continues to contribute to the economic, civic, and social advancement of the Borough of St. Clair; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council, Borough Officials, and the citizens of St. Clair wish to congratulate the Mettam family for perpetuating the oldest continuous business in the Borough of St. Clair.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mayor Richard E. Tomko, on this the 23rd day of October, 2025, do proclaim that the month of November 2025 be "Mettam Brothers Lumber Company Month" in the Borough of St. Clair.
