WINTER WEATHER ALERTS:

Habitual placing of cones, chairs, or any other item on a public street to save a parking space is considered abandoned property and will be taken away by our sanitation and police departments.

When a **snow emergency** is declared, there will be **NO PARKING ALLOWED** on **SECOND STREET** and **HANCOCK STREET**. Watch for posting of streets.

Please be mindful of our **Snow Removal Ordinance** which states that a path on the sidewalk, free of snow and ice, of at least 24 inches, must be maintained before 12 noon of the next day after snow has fallen. Also, when removing snow and ice from the sidewalk, it is unlawful to place snow or ice into the street or any public thoroughfare of the Borough.

As a dog owner, it is your responsibility, and is a requirement as indicated in St. Clair Borough Ordinance No. 362. Please be a responsible pet owner and clean up after your pet.

This year's historical notes will be about events during the year 1776 as part of the celebration of *the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence*.

On January 10, 1776, the "Common Sense" pamphlet by Thomas Paine is published advocating American independence from Great Britain.

On January 18th, 1776, Henry Knox arrived in Massachusetts to finalize plans for the British artillery that he had transported from Fort Ticonderoga.
